## **Where were you 10 years ago? What do you remember about the year 2000 AD?**

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

It may seem hard to believe but it has already been 10 years since we were looking forward to the year of our Lord 2000. As I recall that time, I remember that most of us were not overly anxious about the possible problem of whether our computer systems would be able to handle the switch from a 2-digit format to 4-digit format for handling dates. We called this potential problem Y2K. Instead I remember that most of us were excited about entering not just a new decade and century, but a new millennium as well. I remember that some of the television stations broadcast around the world as the year 2000 slowly made its way around the globe.

Obviously, much has changed in the last 10 years. In the year 2000 we had the closest Presidential election in a generation – one in which the “electoral college” and the “popular vote” were different. And then less than a year later came Sept. 11, 2001 – a day that will live in infamy and an event which still affects us 8½ years later. One obvious result of Sept. 11, 2001, is that our nation is still engaged in two wars.

In the past three years of this decade more notable events have taken place. In 2008 we had another historic presidential election. And I am not sure yet what historians will be calling the last 2 ½ years of this decade. I have heard “The Housing Bubble of 2007”, the Great Recession and the Panic of 2008. I guess we will have to wait and see.

Nevertheless, as we wrap up another decade, it is all the more important for us to declare that our Lord God is with us and has not forsaken us. The scriptures tell us that this has always been the case. Our God is a god who enters into history with us. Our God is a god of the past, the present, and the future. I truly believe that God is preparing us and urging us to share this word of hope and comfort to world that is desperate for the Good News that we have to share.

And as we do close out the year of our Lord 2009 and move into 2010, I want to pause and say thanks once again. Of course, first and foremost I thank the Lord who gives us everything that we need and more. I also thank you for the support and prayers that you have given to me and my family, especially this past year. I want to thank our staff – Patti Kurnot, Kurt Hier, Peggy Forbes, Jim Kamps, Ken Schoenbeck and Kathy Carolin - for the hard work they put in. I want to thank our Council, - President Dave Forbes, VP Gail Ostrowski and Secretary Cheryl Richter. I also want to thank the many volunteers who do so much to keep us going.

May God Bless you and May God bless our worship and prayers in the new year and the years and decades to come.

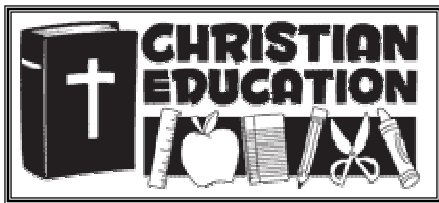
New Folding Chairs are missing from the Fellowship Hall.

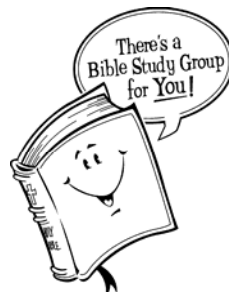

Bins are located in the lobby for these items.

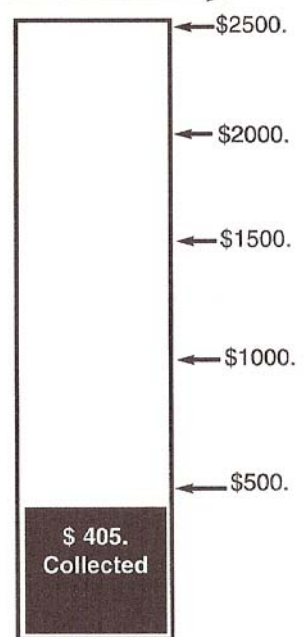
**Cory's Eagle Scout Project**

It has been just over a year since we began our recycling program. Those big dumpsters in our parking lot have helped us earn over \$300.

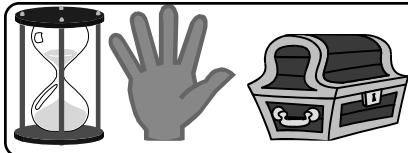
We are currently using the money earned each month to support our food pantry.

What is the purpose of the Property Committee?

Have you ever walked into Our Saviour and said “Boy the grass could sure use a trim” or “Those walls could sure use a coat of paint”? I would have to guess the answer would be no. This is because of the hard work from the Property Committee. There are many members of OSLC that work very hard Monday through Saturday to make our Church look so nice on Sunday.

Ruth and Paul McCaudy are the ring leaders of the Property Committee. They both do a lot of the work themselves and are very good at rounding up volunteers to do other projects. Some of the projects include adding new shelves to the library (you try and pick the ones that were added); a new baby changing table in the ladies room, a new coat of paint has been put on all of the classrooms in the last few months and let’s not forget the new door that was put in the sanctuary that leads to the courtyard. These are just a few of the things that have been done in the last year.

The Property Committee is also responsible for a lot of the general maintenance around the building. Every quarter the water has to be tested, furnace filters are changed, and the septic system needs to be greased and oiled so it works properly. Some of the more challenging jobs are changing the light bulbs in the parking lot and fixing the lights on the steeple. Ruth organized an outdoor and indoor clean up day this spring which involved the help of many members. Dan Smith donated approximately 3 hours of his time every week to do the yard work, and the landscape is kept up all year by volunteers who chose individual beds and maintain them on a weekly basis.

Some of the projects the committee is working can be seen on a daily basis. New stained glass windows are being installed in the Welcome Center. These windows were purchased by members to remember loved ones. The dumpster has been moved to the back of the church to make way for a new shed in the spring. The money for the shed has already been raised thanks to donations from WELCA, Men-in-Mission, and members. Some of the projects in the planning phase include a power door for the ladies restroom and a shower in the bathroom by the Welcome Center to accommodate our guests from Operation Homes.

The items I have written about above just scratch the surface of the Property Committees responsibilities. The people involved with this committee are very passionate and take a lot of pride in OSLC. I would personally like to thank them for their dedication and would encourage anyone in the congregation that is interested in helping out to talk to Ruth. The church belongs to all of us we should all try to contribute when ever we can.
