Giving Thanks to God for 72 Years
(or 140 years or about 1,980 years)
(depending upon how you count them)



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I hope that you found the title of this month's article something that caught your attention or at least made you a little bit curious.

In any case, the reason for my title is that October is the month when we celebrate the anniversary of our congregation's founding. It is also the month when we think a little more about our past. Now, the truth is that we don't know the exact date that this congregation began gathering together to worship God, but we have chosen October because it was in October of 1938 when the official application for membership was made to the Ohio Synod of the United Lutheran Church in America. Under the direction of Pastor Royal Leshner, a constitution was adopted, a list of charter members was drawn up, and our congregation officially became the "Community Evangelical Lutheran Church of Hinckley."

We do know, however, that the roots of this congregation go back even farther and these roots are very ecumenical. Our congregation has some influences from the Disciples of Christ, Methodist, and other congregations as well. One of those congregations began as early as 1870. This is why we give at least two answers when asked how old our congregation is. There is a part of this congregation that is 140 years old and there is another part that is only 72 years old.

However, the followers of Jesus Christ have been sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ since at least 30 AD, and so in another sense you could say that our congregation and every congregation that proclaims Jesus as Lord is part of an organization that is about 1980 years old.

Now some of you may be asking why is it important to know any of this history. I have two reasons. First, it helps me to know that I am part of a much larger mission ministry, one that preceded me and one that will follow me. Down through the ages the people of God have been sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ, and our job is simply to play our parts the best that we can.

Second, whenever I think about 1,980 years of church history, this longer view helps me to put current struggles into perspective. It helps to understand that the church of Jesus Christ has survived all sorts of trials and tribulations, and as long as our Lord continues to give us a mission and to call forth disciples the church will continue to survive, no matter what.

As we join together in worship this month, may knowing how God has been there for us in the past give us confidence that God is with us today and will be with us always. Sincerely yours in Christ, Pastor Scott Silcox

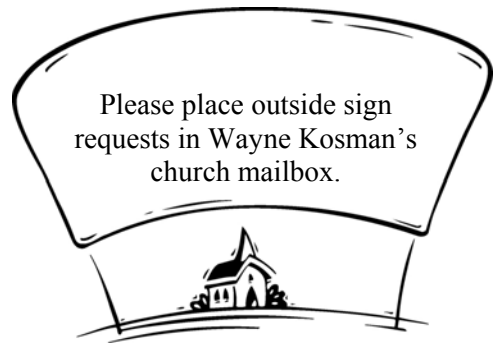

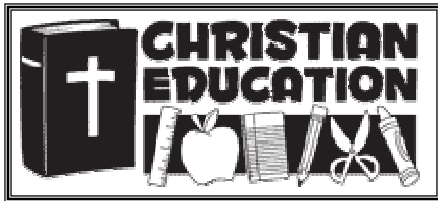

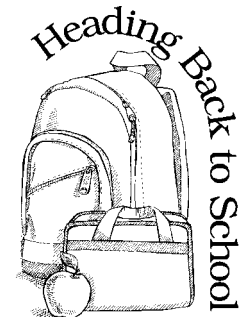
